CONTENT:

Here are some top tips for ensuring your content is clear and safe for all community members:

- **Make your comment clear and informative** – focus on positive and supportive comments when leaving comments underneath other people's work.
- **Stay on topic** – try to focus on the original topic if you are commenting on a discussion thread. If you are wanting to discuss another subject, then please start a new discussion thread.
- **Try not to use abbreviations or "text speak"** – this can sometimes make it difficult for people to understand and follow the discussion.
- **Provide as much information as possible when asking a question** - and if the question is related to a particular person or their work, please name them in the comment
- **Try not to use all capital letters in your posts** – this could be considered "shouting" online and it can make the post difficult to read.
